## MESSAGE ARTICLE – JUNE 2016 Rabbi Shae J. Kane D.D.

In the secular calendar month of June this year, we will celebrate the Festival of Shavuot – Z'man matan torateinu – the Season of the giving of our Torah. Although everyone agrees that the food of choice for Shavuot is cheese (most typically blintzes, or the Sephardic equivalent such as burekas, cheese-filled dough pockets), there are, however, differences of opinion as to why it is a custom. Some derive the practice directly from scripture, saying we eat dairy to symbolize the "land flowing with milk and honey" (Exodus 3:8) promised to the Children of Israel. This passage, along with "The precepts of the Lord are... sweeter than honey" (Psalm 19:9-11) also indicate we should eat honey, which is customary in some communities.

A sage discovered that the initials of the four Hebrew words in Numbers 28:26, which describe the sacrificial meal offering on Shavuot, spell mei halav (from milk), suggesting that dairy food is the acceptable dinner for the festival. At Sinai, the Israelites were considered to be as innocent as newborns, whose food is milk. Those of a kabbalistic bent equate the numerical value of the word halav, 40 ('het'=8, 'lamed'=30, 'vet'=2), with the number of days Moses spent on Mount Sinai receiving the Ten Commandments and other mitzvot (Exodus 24:18). Others look to the mountain itself, which is termed in Psalms mount of gavnunim (68:15), meaning many peaks. They connect that description with the Hebrew word g'vinah, meaning cheese. Some scholars who trace all Jewish customs and rituals to practices common among various ethnic groups claim that spring harvest festivals characteristically featured dairy dishes, perhaps because cheese was produced during that season.

Along with blintzes and burekas, cheesecake is widely popular for ingestion on *Shavuot*. Some eat kreplach, three-cornered dumplings that can be filled with cheese. They are supposed to remind us of the *Tanach* (our Bible), which is comprised of three sections (*Torah*, *Nevi'im*, and *Ketuvim*. Torah, Prophets, and Writings). In addition the Torah, which was given to the three categories of the Children of Israel (*Kohanim*, *Levi'im*, and *Yisraelim*) through Moses, who was the third child of Amram and Jocheved (after Aaron and Miriam), following three days of preparation (Exodus 19:11) in the third month of the year (Exodus 19:1).

This month's "spotlight" falls on Dennies Gajadhar. Dennies was born and grew up in the Caribbean. All of her schooling was there including a college degree from Antigua State College. She came to the U.S. from Anguilla 14 years ago and became a nanny for the Haiman family in Wayne New Jersey where she worked for about seven years. She then came to Brooklyn and worked with the Rosenberg family from Monsey, also as a nanny, where she still works. While working with the Haimans, Dennies, who grew up Catholic and never heard of a Jew, became curious. She heard the beautiful melodies and saw the wonderful rituals. She then saw an article about Reform Judaism in URJ, a publication of the Union For Reform Judaism. She was intrigued. A trip to Union Temple in Brooklyn from Wayne N.J. came next and was not easy. She got lost on her first try, was afraid to enter the building on her second try but, finally, went in on her third try. After about a year of listening to songs in a strange language she decided to convert. Classes in Manhattan followed and a year later, after a trip to the Mikvah she became a Jew! She was advised to move to a Jewish neighborhood and now lives on a nearby block mostly inhabited by orthodox Jews. Her neighbors have been very supportive and helpful, inviting her for meals, a seder, baby namings, Bar Mitzvahs, etc. She switched to Madison Jewish Center at the urging of a neighbor so that she could walk and not drive to Shul. Her nanny days may be over soon since she is now studying business administration at Kingsboro Community College. How fortunate we are to know Dennies.


