**MESSAGE ARTICLE – JULY-AUGUST 2018****Rabbi Shae J. Kane D.D.****SUMMER FOOD FOR THOUGHT**

Many of us usually take vacation during the summer months or, at least, are able to glean some joy from the warmer weather and the lingering light of the long summer twilights. This change of pace allows us the luxury of giving thought to evaluating and giving perspective to our lives. The Jewish Calendar enhances this process with the tradition of Sounding the *Shofar* during the Month of *Elul* – this year beginning on August 12. From the very beginning of the month there is the custom of ending the morning services with the Sounding of the *Shofar*. In what language is the *Shofar* speaking? What exactly is it saying? What is the power of its appeal that people rush each year especially on *Rosh HaShannah* and *Yom Kippur* to houses of worship to be serenaded by its raspy tones?

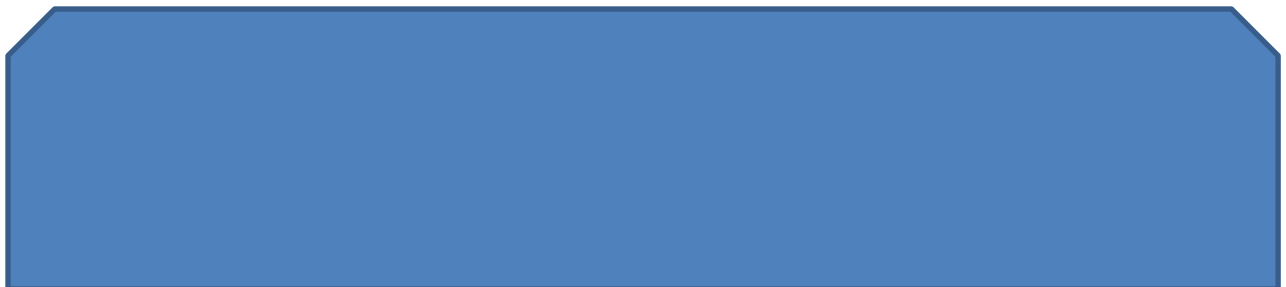
There are a number of universal languages which speak to our bodies and our souls - for example: music, art, food and love. The *Shofar* is of another realm altogether, although catering to the sense of hearing the *Shofar* is not respected for its musicality. What then is the grand attraction? The Blessing we make on *Rosh HaShannah* for the *Shofar* ends with: “*lishmoah kol shofar*” it is usually translated as “to hear or to listen to the *Kol* - the voice of the *Shofar*”. Similarly we find Abraham was advised to listen to the *Kol* of Sarah when dealing with *Yishmael*. What is the difference between listening to Sarah and hearing the *Kol* -the voice - of Sarah?

A wife nudges her husband after many years of marriage, saying: “You never take me out any more.” He responds quickly and invites her out for dinner. At the restaurant he engages all those around him in lively conversation. Like a talk show host he meets and greets and banters all evening with everyone, except his wife. At the night’s end she is in tears. Frustrated he rolls his eyes way back and exclaims, “What do you want from me? I took you out!”

When the wife said, “You never take me out any more” the husband listened to her but didn’t hear what she meant. She wanted him to give her his undivided personal attention not just a restaurant meal. Sure the superficial meaning of her request called for just “going out” but the deeper meaning was imbedded in the tone of her message. “Going out” was a good start but she wanted his heart, and that can’t be delivered upon demand.

There are two ways to cook something, although my family would say I am the last person who should be giving cooking advice. One is the old-fashioned way of putting a roast, for example, in the oven. The heat from without gradually penetrates to the center. At some premature point it may look “done” on the outside but it is in fact raw and unaffected on the inside. The new-fangled way is by microwaving the roast. In this instance it cooks from the inside out. The last thing to show signs of “being done” is the outside.

Leading up to and on *Rosh HaShannah*, *Kol Shofar* penetrating our insides and going right to our heart and soul - radiating into the *Yiddish N’shamah* within. The *Shofar* speaks with fluency in the language of the soul and, with its raw and raspy cry, it motivates those who hear it well to begin to cook from the inside and thereby to listen to our inner Jewish Psyche.

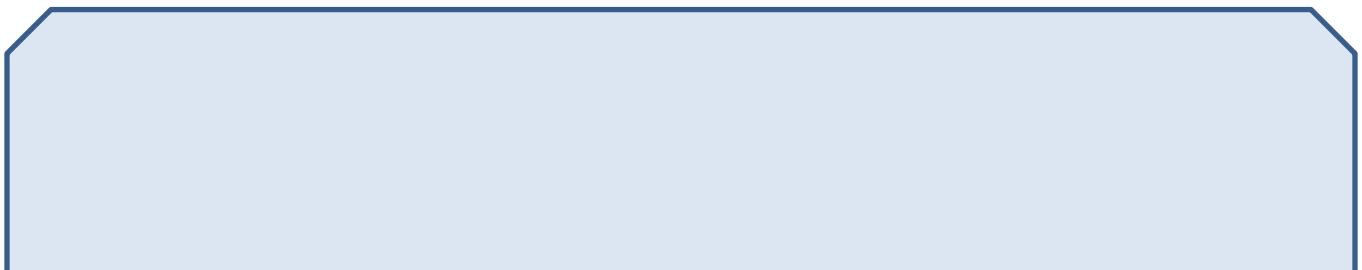
