#### MESSAGE ARTICLE – October 2021 Rabbi Shae J. Kane D.D.

The complete and correct name for the month following *Tishrei* is *Heshvan*, and it has become a minhag – tradition, to call it *MarHeshvan* the bitter month of *Heshvan* due to its lack of holidays, [*mar* is Hebrew for bitter, hence the word *maror* the bitter herb for *Pesahl*. The *Shulkhan Arukh uses the* name for this fall month as the one-word *MarHeshvan*.

The Bible's usual references to the months use their ordinal numbers, although occasionally ancient Israelite names are also used i.e., *Aviv* the 1<sup>st</sup> month, *Ziv* the 2<sup>nd</sup> month, *Ethanim* the 7<sup>th</sup> month, and *Bul* the 8<sup>th</sup> month. The currently used Jewish names for the months were imported from Babylonia. Many of these names appear in post-exilic books of the Bible. Some of the months are derived from the names of ancient gods, such as *Tammuz* which is thought to come from the Assyrian Du-mu-zu, an Egyptian god, and is mentioned as the name of an idol in Ezekiel 8:14.

*MarHeshvan* is probably derived from its location in the calendar. In Akkadian (Babylonian/Assyrian), "w" (vav) and "m" (mem) sounds can interchange. As a result, MarHeshvan - which is from the two words "m'rach" and "shvan," - would have been "warh" and "shman," in Akkadian MarHeshvan, corresponding to the Hebrew "yereh\_sh'mini," thus "the eighth month." In the Yemenite tradition, the name of the month is pronounced Marah-sha'wan, not MarHeshvan as in the Ashkenazic tradition, and this would seem to preserve a greater fidelity to the original. When the eighth month is mentioned in the Mishnah and Talmud, it is referred to as MarHeshvan. And throughout all of Rashi's biblical and talmudic commentary, he also refers to the month as MarHeshvan. Maimonides and Ibn Ezra also use the complete name of MarHeshvan.

This duality of names has *halakhic* implications. Since the practice of simply calling the month <u>Heshvan</u> is so widespread, either <u>Heshvan</u> or the two-word <u>Mar Heshvan</u> is now acceptable practice in the <u>SHulhan</u> Arukh if used in a legal document such as a <u>get</u>. In <u>Even ha'Ezer</u>, Rabbi Jacob ben Asher - Rashi's grandson - lists only <u>Mar Heshvan</u> as the month's name and does not give the <u>halakhah</u> if one wrote either just <u>Heshvan</u> or the two-word <u>Mar Heshvan</u>. Others even accept the Biblical name of the month, "<u>Bul</u>," if it was used in a document. The <u>SHulhan Arukh</u> states that the <u>halakhah</u> is the same for the imprecise usage of <u>Menahem Av</u>.

Surprisingly, there are even customs that developed around the use of *Mar Heshvan*. The assumption is that it is called *Mar Heshvan* (the bitter month of Heshvan) either due to its lack of holidays or because it is when *Sarah Imoteinu*, Sarah our Matriarch died. Because of those negative associations, there are those who refrain from getting married in *Mar Heshvan*. Others claim that this was the *minhag* only in Jerusalem but outside this local people are not concerned with this and get married in *Heshvan*. The only explanation that I have found for calling this month by the two-word name *Mar Heshvan* is based on the fact that it is the beginning of the rainy season. The Targum translated *mar* as *tipah*, a drop, in the verse "*Hen goyim k'mar midli* — Behold, the nations are as a drop of water from a bucket" (Isaiah 40:15). As such, the name means the "rainy *Heshvan*," and far from *mar* meaning bitter, it connotes a month of blessed rain. There is a wonderful *midrash* about the future of *Mar Heshvan* indicating that the dedication of the Third Temple will occur in *Mar Heshvan* removing any doubt about it being a bitter month.






