Rabbi's Message

As Passover (Pesach) is nearly upon us, I wanted to enlighten you about undertakings that we use and do quite often, maybe from instinct or maybe we were told when we were children, but may not be aware of or know the root of.

In Jewish tradition, **Hiddur Mitzvah** (הַדְדוּר מִצְוָה); "Beautifying a mitzvah" is the practice of performing a commandment by going above and beyond the bare minimum required by the Torah, or Rabbinic Law. This principle is drawn from the biblical verse that is in the Torah reading on the seventh day of Pesach from Shirat Hayam, (Song of the Sea): "*This is my G-d and I will glorify/beautify Him*" (Exodus 15:2). The Talmud explains that since we cannot literally add glory to G-d, we glorify Him through by attempting to beautifying our performances of Mitzvot, his commandments. Hiddur Mitzvah can be put into operation or accomplished in various ways. Here are a few examples:

1. Choosing ritual objects that are aesthetically pleasing such as using a hand-painted or silk **Tallit** instead of a plain one.
2. Buying a high-quality, silver, or artistic **Menorah for** (Hanukkah).
3. On **Sukkot**, finding a "hadar" (beautiful) **Etrog** that is symmetrical and without blemishes and/or decorating a **Sukkah** with fruits, flowers, and garlands rather than leaving it as a bare frame.

Modern and Chassidic interpretations also apply **Hiddur Mitzvah** to the spirit and intention behind the act. For example, try to perform a mitzvah with more joy and deep focus (kavanah) rather than by rote. To the various Mitzvot that exist, Hiddur Mitzvah applies in different ways. Mitzvot Bein Adam L'Chavero (commandments between a man and neighbor/friend), such as offering a warm smile or listening intently, showing a deeper devotion of kindness and care is an example of Hiddur Mitzvah

One can be creative as well with Hiddur Mitzvah. Using a child-made or family made Seder plate, challah cover; something personalized are examples of Hiddur Mitzvah.

When someone adds a special food to a meal that changes the norm of that meal that is also Hiddur Mitzvah.

The principle Hiddur Mitzvah is always around us if we apply ourselves to improving our awareness of the Mitzvot we are doing. Hiddur Mitzvah is also designed to be an illustration for others. When others see you performing a Hiddur Mitzvah, it will hopefully inspire them to follow your example.

So even though we may have been doing this naturally without thought for years, it is incumbent us to be aware of these upgrades to fully appreciate the concept of Hiddur Mitzvah.

My wife's cousin, Ralph, is a very pragmatic practicing Jew. His wife Stacey, passed away after a horrible illness in early 2025 and she was an expert on Hiddur Mitzvah. Ralph refers to her often that her efforts became family traditions, but in fact she adjusted them slightly every year to continue the example of Hiddur Mitzvah. Ralph and I have a close relationship, we share deep Torah discussions and dialog, that lift us spiritually and emotionally. We also share the same warped sense of humor which adds to the relationship.

So, in closing, I will use Ralph's Pesach message to his family and friends for my Pesach message.

May your tables be filled with stories and songs and laughter and a growing narrative of your family's story. May your seders be the absolute best possible. Take the time to make them new and meaningful, so much so that next year, when you're sitting at the table surrounded by family (old and new), friends (old and new) you'll have a new custom to carry forward. Because that's the history of us as a family, as a people, as a nation.

I want to wish all of you, a chag sameach v'kasher (a happy and kosher Passover), or from the Yiddish, a zissen (sweet) Pesach.

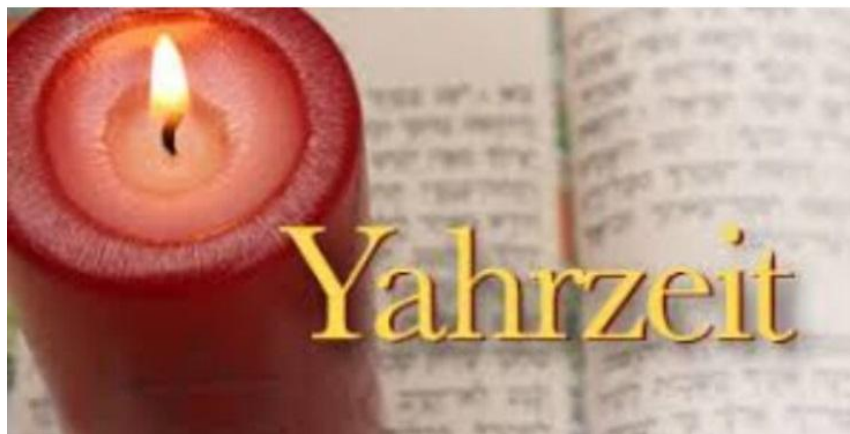

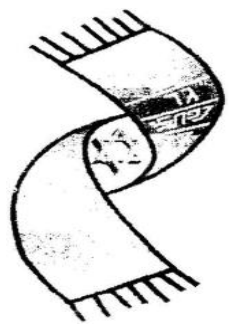
